# Go Cas for Cambodia

On Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May the School Council is hosting a non-school uniform day called Cas (as in casual) for Cambodia! This is to raise money for New Hope School, Cambodia.

The money is needed for:

- \$8 (£6) to buy food for the children
- \$10 (£8) for 2 sets of school uniform for 1 child per year
- \$15 (£12) for 1 set of school supplies (pencils, pens, exercise books etc)
- \$25 (£20) for 1 food package
- \$40 (£32) to educate a child for a month
- \$50 (£40) for a bicycle to travel to school
- \$100 (£80) for small renovations to fix their school building

If everyone brings in £1 it can really make a difference for Cambodia (and if you can make a bigger donation that would be amazing!) It is also okay if you can't make a donation - just come in cas and send love to New Hope School instead.

As part of our ongoing commitment to safeguarding our students online, we are always looking for ways to improve our provision for children and parents. Research suggests that the knowledge and education of parents in online safety is one of the most critical aspects of keeping children safe, with one survey from <u>internetmatters.org</u> showing that '81% of children turn to a parent for this information, followed secondly by teachers (70%).' As such, we would like to empower all of our Heber parents and carers to have the best possible knowledge of devices, apps, websites and parental controls.

We will therefore be sharing regular information within our newsletter which we hope will prove beneficial in understanding how our children are using the internet and knowing how best to help them stay safe whilst doing so.
