#### Why are we doing this?

92 million tonnes of clothing waste are sent to landfill every year and between 80 and 100 billion news items of clothing are produced every year globally. We are doing a clothes swap because we don't want our clothes to go to waste, instead we want to give them new homes.

Items will be limited to jumpers, coats, t-shirts/shirts, trousers and shoes. Number of items you can donate is limited to **4 items per child enrolled at Heber** so that we don't have a huge surplus (this may change depending on how many clothes are collected in the weeks prior). Any clothes left at the end will be given to Get Rid of and Donate. Please ensure that clothes are of a decent quality and clean!
