Online Safety - Filtering and Monitoring

As part of recent updates to government guidelines on online safety, we have implemented a new monitoring system on all Heber computers and devices. While we have always maintained robust filtering systems to prevent access to any harmful or inappropriate content, we have now introduced a system called 'Classroom Cloud' for real-time monitoring.

Operating in the background of all our devices, the monitoring system offers insights into users' actions. Should children attempt to access or type any content deemed inappropriate based on an extensive 'safeguarding' keywords list, our Designated Safeguarding Leads will receive immediate alerts, enabling them to take necessary actions promptly.

This new monitoring capability allows us to track children's device activity continuously, both online and offline. Therefore, even if children attempt to access a prohibited website that our filtering system blocks, we will still receive an alert along with a screenshot.

We are confident that this new system will further enhance our ability to ensure the e-safety of all our pupils.
