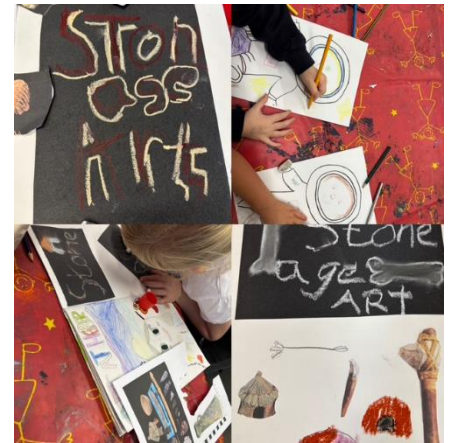
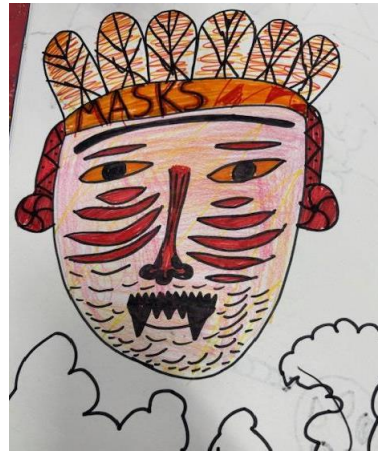
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## This week in the Art Room...

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## Immersion Days

### Year 2

Year 2 had a wonderful immersion day. Dressed as activists or monarchs from a range of moments in history, the children looked fantastic! From Martin Luther King to Queen Margot of Navarre, the children learnt from each other about these extraordinary historical figures. Year 2 enjoyed a variety of activities including human bingo, learning some protest songs, creating some activist art and designing a protest. We need to give a special thank you to Rosa's mum who came in to talk about the work she does as a campaigner and who facilitated a session on protest design. The children even got to use a megaphone!



### Year 5

Year 5 had a fantastic day going back in time to experience what life would be like as an Ancient Greek. Their costumes were outstanding, from Gods to Spartan warriors to citizens of Athens. During the day, we made Ancient Greek vases out of clay, competed in the Olympics, learnt about what it would have been like to live in Greece in 500BC and finally, we ate and rated some delicious Greek delicacies. We tried stuffed vine leaves, olives, pita bread and hummus. Delicious!



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## Year 3

This week, Year 3 was visited by a time traveler who took the children all the way back to the Stone Age! We discovered what life was like in all three periods of the Stone Age. We became nomads, hunter gathers, farmers, and traders. We then went on to create our own 'cave art' using charcoal, paints and pastels. We also tackled Stone Age-themed maths challenges, including designing their very own number system. To understand survival in the early Stone Age, we learnt about the importance of hunting and gathering food. We then stepped into the role of hunter-gatherers themselves, foraging around the school playground. We concluded the day with an investigation into the mystery of Stonehenge. After studying a bird's-eye view map of the site, we worked together to construct our own versions of Stonehenge—using biscuits.



By Elodie, 3R: On Tuesday, it was our immersion day all about Stone Age. We learnt about Stonehenge and how it just appeared. We learnt that they used the Stonehenge to bury dead people like a cemetery. The big stones came from Wales and this happened 5,000 years ago. We even got to build our own Stonehenge out of biscuits! On brown paper, we also got to do our own cave paintings. I used chalk to draw a deer, a pig and different people. It looked like a real painting.

By Otto, 3R: In KS2: Year 3, we have been doing an immersion day all about the Stone Age. We did some Stone Age maths and made a BISCUIT Stonehenge - that was my favourite part. We also learnt humans have been living for thousands of years.
