With the fair last Sunday, (what a day!!!) and the ice cream sale on Friday, we're closing a term (and a year) full of AMAZING events - with huge thanks to everyone who's helped to plan them, whose put their hands up and actually made them happen, and who's supported by attending, buying and donating.
