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

## Anti-Bullying Week

The children at Heber really did 'Make Some Noise' about bullying last week. From puppet shows, to pop videos, to performance poetry and raps, the children have created such a wide variety of work making sure everyone knows Heber is a place where uniqueness is celebrated and any negative behaviour won't be tolerated.

We kick started the week with our Odd Socks Day which inspired the Nursery children to come up with 'kind words' that they could share with each other.

- Reception were inspired by Andy from Cbeebies and the Odd Sock song! They created their own version of the music video which we will be sharing with parents soon.
- Year 1 worked together to create class poems. They shared the importance of being unique and how it is important to tell
  their trusted adult if they are worried about something.
- Year 2 used their socks to create fantastic puppet shows! Each group created an amazing storyboard and acted out the scenarios they created. They were very clear in their 'Don't Do That' message.
- Year 3 wrote the most fantastic raps! They were able to write their raps and added a lot of passion into their performances.
- Year 4 created beautiful poetry reminding everyone to 'Say No to Bullying' and that everyone is part of the Heber family.
- Year 5 were inspired to be creative too. 5G were brilliant at creating and performing their anti-bullying messages. 5K chose to write from the perspective of a victim or a bystander and produced some very emotional poems. Poems below by Sam and Fred.
- Year 6 had some fantastic discussions and debate around the subject of banter. Their banter or bullying work was great. Not content with that, they also wrote anti-bullying raps and poems!


There are three shaded right-angled triangles, each with two sides of 10 cm length. They are arranged as in the diagram. What is the area of the white trapezium at the top?
