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Immersion Day – Year 4

Year 4's new geography topic is 'Are all settlements in Europe the same?' To begin the topic, we decided to take advantage of the wonderful community we have at Heber School, and invited in family members and staff who are either from another country in Europe, or who have lived in or have an affinity with another country in Europe. We were very lucky to have parents and staff come in representing Spain, Albania, Germany, Italy, France, Scotland, Switzerland, The Netherlands and Poland. Each country had a table as a 'travel agent' and the children visited each of them to learn as much as they could. They were given passports to fill in, with a page for each country. With passports in hand, the children went from travel agent to travel agent in small groups asking open ended questions to find out as much as they could about each of the countries. The children loved the experience and learnt just how diverse the wonderful continent of Europe is. A huge thank you to all the parents and staff who went to such an amazing effort to put together props, bring in photographs, tasty foods and souvenirs from home. It is really appreciated and gave the children a great start to their new topic. In the afternoon we then worked together on a tricky European map jigsaw, piecing together all the countries. We also researched Europe's mountains and rivers to design our own board games based on our findings.

3R Gunnersbury Park Museum

On Monday, 3R took an incredibly long journey to Gunnersbury Park Museum where they got to explore a range of Ancient Roman artefacts and replicas as part of our History topic: Why were the Romans so Successful? In our workshop, we learnt about key Roman figures such as Julius Caesar and Queen Boudicca. All the children got the opportunity to role play as a Roman legionary and use their shield to protect themselves against enemy fire. We also saw some Roman pottery and glasswork, and learned about how trade and learning from other cultures in the empire was key to their success. Finally, we got to explore the museum's collections of Roman and Stone Age artefacts from the Ealing area. It was so interesting to see artefacts from London. Well done 3R!

This week in Music...

KS1 have continued learning about pitch and rhythm; exploring music using their voices and percussion instruments, tuned and untuned.

Year 1 have been creating and showcasing their own short pieces, using the chime bars and the claves. They all showed that they have a great understanding of how to use the different instruments to achieve different sounds. Year one have been exploring their singing voices, singing on their own and as part of a group.

Year 2 have been learning about tempo; playing their instruments quickly and slowly. This week they learned about the note La. They learned the action for La, how to sing it and how to use it with So and Mi to make melodies. We also enjoyed a lovely performance from Colette, who accompanied herself on the guitar, singing Eleanor Rigby.

KS2 have been continuing their musical journeys, learning about different musical concepts, styles and eras.

Year 3 have been preparing their Foley sounds for an animated snoopy clip. They have created their own Cue Sheets, outlining which instruments they have decided to use to make the different cartoon sounds. Highlights include using a stapler to make the sound of a door shutting and a triangle for a ticking timer.

Year 4 have been working in groups to create pieces of music based around their chosen artwork. They have been using instruments to create rhythms and melodies that capture the mood of the piece and bring it to life. They have also been learning to read and clap the tricky rhythms ti-tika and tika-ti

Year 5 have been singing and playing instruments in the round, as part of their exploration of canons and rounds. They have also learned 4 partner songs (separate melodies that harmonise when sung together at the same time). Year 5 sang all 4 songs together in harmony and sounded beautiful!

Year 6 have now covered the Baroque and Classical periods and are looking forward to the Romantic era next week. Last week, they compared two movements of Vivaldi's Four Seasons and discussed their similarities and differences. This week they listened to a Mozart clarinet concerto and piano sonata. They formed a human piano, taking one note each and having a go at playing arpeggios and an Alberto bass.



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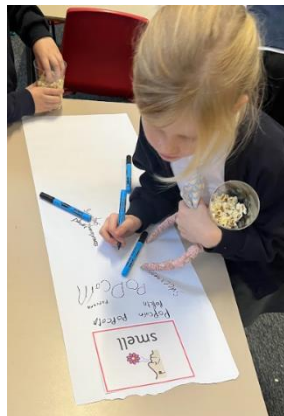
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Year 3 - Welcome to the Circus!
